



# The 4 Jubilee Routes in Rome

The four routes pass the way of the three Jubilar Churches, chosen by the Pontifical Council for the Promoting of the New Evangelization. The three Churches are: **San Salvatore in Lauro, Santa Maria in Vallicella (Chiesa Nuova) and San Giovanni dei Fiorentini**. In these three Churches will be the constant presence of priests speaking more languages (the Missionaries of Mercy) available for confession and prayer during the Eucharist Adoration. If it is required, they are also available for catechesis about the mercy, to prepare pilgrims to cross the Holy Door with spirit of conversion. The three Churches will be connected by a pedestrian way in direction of the St. Peter's Basilica.



### The **PAPAL** Route

This is the route taken for centuries by the Popes, particularly on the occasion of their election and their taking of possession of Rome as the City's Bishop. A long procession accompanied the Pope through the streets of Campus Martius and Celio to go from St Peter's to the Basilica of St. John Lateran, the cathedral of Rome. The itinerary now ends past ancient monasteries and medieval churches, the most important remains of Imperial Rome and the imposing churches of the 16th and 17th centuries, before reaching the **Jubilee church of S. Maria in Vallicella**, where San Filippo Neri is buried.

# The Route of MERCY

This route connects St. John in Lateran to St. Peter's through the ancient heart of Rome, but covering in the final part the itinerary of the pilgrims who used to arrive from the North, from Porta del Popolo, passing past the **Jubilee church of St. Salvatore at the Laurels** in the Ponte district, which is located on the route towards Ponte S. Angelo and St. Peter's.

# The **PILGRIM'S** Route

This is one of the traditional itineraries for medieval pilgrims who reached Rome from various parts of Italy and Europe. From the Basilica of St. John Lateran, this walk comes out near the banks of the Tiber. On the way it passes by The Most Holy Trinity of the Pilgrims, the historic point of welcome for tens of thousands of pilgrims in the jubilees of the 16th and 17th centuries, linked to the work of San Filippo Neri. It continues along Via Giulia, before reaching the Jubilee church of San Giovanni dei Fiorentini. S. Angelo bridge then takes the pilgrim to the other side of the river heading towards St. Peter's Basilica.

### The MARIAN Route

This is the route which unites the Basilica of St. Mary Major, dedicated to the Holy Mother, to numerous sacred sites dedicated to Mary, for centuries the centre of devotion for the people of Rome. such as S. Maria dei Monti and Santa Maria in Campitelli. Near the end it reaches the Jubilee church of Santa Maria in Vallicella, dedicated to the Nativity of Mary and where a miraculous image of the Virgin is worshipped, to then continue to St Peter's.

# Iubitinera Official app of O.R.P. for the Jubilee Routes



#### lubitinera is the official app of the 4 Routes of the Jubilee, a valuable support to enrich your pilgrimage to Rome for the Jubilee of Mercy.

Iubitinera is a free app that you can use also off-line. It accompanies you along the 4 Routes of the Jubilee of Mercy in Rome: it shows you the path and, near each stage, warns you with a notification. It describes more than 60 points of interest, located along the Routes, providing a rich description of historical, artistic and spiritual content, sided with images.

For each stage is available a description that connects the place to the history of the Church and to Saints, witnesses of Faith, but also to the millenary history of Rome and its immense artistic heritage.

For each stage, lubitinera gives you also detailed and updated information about: opening hours of churches, timetable for Holy Masses, Eucharistic Adoration, liturgies like Vespers or Lauds, moments of prayer, information on availability of confessors in different languages, phone numbers, e-mail addresses and websites. At some stages, it suggests a meditation inspired by the Seven Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy.

For each stage, it shows nearest stops of the Roma Cristiana Open Bus service provided by Opera Romana Pellegrinaggi, whose path has been specifically meant to assist the stages of the 4 Jubilee Routes. Alternatively, you are shown the nearest stops of Rome's public transport (Bus or Metro). Iubitinera will also provide information on the distance traveled, or the one you still have to go, before arriving at St. Peter's Basilica and going through the Holy Door. It keeps track of the path you have made and gives you the opportunity to share it with your friends through the main social networks. At the end of the Route, lubitinera also allows you to receive, if desired, the Testimonium, a document confirming the completion of the Route, followed by you.






# **St. Peter's Basilica and Papal Tombs**

«You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it». (Mt 16,18)

Built on the tomb of Peter, the Basilica was erected around the year 320 by Emperor Constantine. It is located on the Vatican hill, not far from the Circus of Nero, the place of martyrdom where the first apostle was crucified just like his Master Jesus. Today, on this burial ground there is the Papal altar, symbol of the mission of the Church which is always renewing itself: The Bishop of Rome is in fact Peter's successor. Built on the site of the Constantine Basilica, today it is an expression of the volition of the Popes of the Renaissance, who made use of the brilliance of the greatest artists of the time such as Donato Bramante and Michelangelo. The magnificent seventeenth-century facade by Carlo Maderno and Bernini's colonnade still welcome the faithful to the Eternal City in a symbolic embrace. Visitors must not miss the visit to the tombs of the Popes located in the Vatican Grottos, where you can stop to pray before the tomb of Peter and those of his successors.

# Vatican Museums and the Sistine Chapel

The beauty and the frescoes that we contemplate here introduce us into the world of Revelation. (St. John Paul II)

The Vatican Museums are considered among the most important in the world and their visit is essential and indispensable for anyone who comes to Rome. Here the Popes have, over time, collected and preserved some of the greatest masterpieces of all time and the most valuable witnesses of the past. They first put at the disposal of culture and public the art collections of their palaces. The Sistine Chapel is "a priceless cultural and universal heritage. This is confirmed by the countless pilgrims from every nation in the world who come to admire the work of the supreme masters and to recognize in this Chapel a sort of wonderful synthesis of painting.[...] from the Sistine Chapel Christ expresses in himself the whole mystery of the visibility of the Invisible.[...] It is difficult however, not to recognize in the visible and humanized Creator, God clad in infinite majesty. Indeed, as far as the image with its intrinsic limits permits, everything which could be expressed has been expressed here. The majesty of the Creator, like that of the Judge, speaks of divine grandeur: a moving and univocal word just as, in a different way, the Pietà in St Peter's Basilica". (St. John Paul II)

# **ST. PETER'S MAMERTINE PRISON**

Located at the foot of the Capitol with an expansive view of the Roman Forum, the Tullianum, the oldest Roman prison, is the place where, according to tradition, the Apostles Peter and Paul were held captive and spent their last days before their martyrdom. In Tullianum, known as Mamertino in the Middle Ages, other famous historical figures were also imprisoned including Vercingetorix, King of the Gauls and Jugurtha, King of Numidia. It is hard to say with certainty when this site lost its function as a prison to become a place of pilgrimage for early Christians. According to some sources it became a place of worship as early as the 4th century, when Pope Sylvester I dedicated it to St. Peter in Prison. Today the complex is located below the Church of St. Joseph, built by the Confraternity of Carpenters from 1597.

# Basilica of St. John Lateran, Cloister, Holy Stairs and Sancta Sanctorum

The Mother of all the churches in Rome and the world

The Archbasilica of the Most Sacred Saviour and the Saints John the Baptist and Evangelist, more commonly known as St. John Lateran, is the oldest church in the western world. It was a Papal residence until the XIV century and is now the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome and the official ecclesiastical seat of the Bishop of Rome. It was built during the pontificate of Pope Miltiades on a property belonging to the Lateran family, donated to the Pope by Constantine as a sign of his gratitude to Christ after the victory over Maxentius at the Battle of Milvian Bridge on October 28, 312. Papal residence until the nineteenth century is currently the Cathedral of the Diocese of Rome and the official ecclesiastical seat of the Bishop of Rome One thousand years later, in 1300, the first Jubilee in history was proclaimed here and later, during the Jubilee of 1423, Pope Martin V opened the Holy Door for the first time, a ceremony which was later also extended to other Basilicas. Located on the eastern side of the Square, the Holy Stairs are part of what remains of the old Lateran Palace. Identified by tradition with the stairs of the Praetorium of Pilate on which Jesus is said to have walked for questioning before the crucifixion, it was installed in 1586, by order of Pope Sixtus V, to provide access to the papal chapel, the Sancta Sanctorum, so called because of the many relics it houses.
